WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO PRAY?

Saint Therese of Lisieux said, "For me, prayer is a burst from my heart, it is a simple glance thrown toward heaven, a cry of thanksgiving and love in times of trial as well as in times of joy." The Catholic Catechism tells us in paragraph 2558 that the faithful must have a "vital and personal relationship with the living and true God. This relationship is prayer." In fact, Part Four of the Catechism is entirely dedicated to helping us understand the meaning of Christian Prayer – an excellent resource!

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO LISTEN?

Psalm 46:10 has an answer: "Be still and know that I am God." In our busy world, this can be one of the most difficult things to put into practice. It requires intentionality and effort to tune out the noise of life.

God can speak to us through other people, with a tug at our heart, or by revealing things to us in holy silence. We must keep our spiritual antennae up for signs in others, in nature, through the sacraments, and in prayer to receive the messages God intends for us.

We can improve our listening through self-discipline, purposefully removing distractions, and evaluating whether our own emotions might be an obstacle. Then, we patiently wait - God speaks in his time. We must trust in his providence and guidance.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO SERVE?

What better example of service have we than Jesus himself, kneeling to wash the feet of his disciples the night of his sacred Passion? He leaves us with the instruction, "...do as I have done for you." –John 13:17

God calls us to pour out his love for others in many ways – he has equipped each of us with unique gifts; designed us with a holy purpose. As Christians, we endeavor to step outside ourselves to follow the model of our Lord, and seek opportunities to serve others.

Consider how or who you feel the Lord is calling you to serve and how you can answer that call.
